The MWRC at the American Academy of Religion: 18-21 November

As a new Related Scholarly Organization of the AAR, the MWRC will be hosting a session on 'New Research on Methodism and the Holiness Movements in Britain' on **Monday 20 November** from **4:00 PM** to **6:30 PM** in the **Beacon, Room B (Third level)** at the **Sheraton Hotel.**

This session highlights the research of recent Visiting Research Fellows of the Manchester Wesley Research Centre. Two presentations will focus on early Methodism based on research done at the Methodist Archives and Research Centre at the John Rylands Library in Manchester. The other two presentations stem from research in the Church of the Nazarene in the UK archives at Nazarene Theological College and other little-known collections relating to the Holiness Movements in the UK. Collectively the presentations serve as examples of the widerange of research possibilities on Methodism and the Holiness Movements that may be undertaken utilizing resources in the UK (particularly in Manchester).
