The next Methodist Studies Seminar will be at the John Rylands Library in Manchester (organised by the MWRC and Cliff College) on **Friday 20 April 2018**. Call for Applications for 2018 MWRC Visiting Fellowships

The MWRC is accepting applications for three visiting fellowships:

- 1) <u>The MWRC Sabbatical Fellowship</u>. This new Sabbatical Fellowship is for pastors, laypeople, and missionaries. The aim of this fellowship is to provide time and space for research and theological reflection on the Methodist, Wesleyan, and evangelical traditions. The fellowship recipient will be provided with accommodation for two to three weeks at Nazarene Theological College. Applications are being accepted until **31 January 2018**.
- 2-3) The John Rylands Research Institute-MWRC Joint Visiting Research Fellowship and the MWRC Visiting Research Fellowship. These are six week fellowships are for visiting scholars undertaking research in the Methodist, Wesleyan, and/or evangelical traditions.
